

- 2.5 The recommended curriculum should include
- Relevant physiology
 - Safety precautions and possible dangers
 - Circumstances where oxygen may be helpful or harmful
 - Full working knowledge of the equipment
 - Cleaning, disinfection, disposal and maintenance of equipment
 - Flow rates for different age groups and with the delivery devices taught
 - Oxygen therapy for the victim who is breathing
 - Mouth-to-mask resuscitation with supplementary oxygen
 - Emphasis on repeated practice
 - The need for at least two trained persons to be present, wherever possible
- 2.6 The equipment taught in the Oxygen Resuscitation Award should provide only simple oxygen flow or simple oxygen flow which is clearly separated from the advanced device - bag or manually triggered head. Multi purpose heads should be reserved for the Oxygen Equipment Award.
- 2.7 The Oxygen Resuscitation Award should be taught and examined on the type of equipment customarily used by the candidate and should be valid only for that equipment or equipment.
- 2.8 The Oxygen Resuscitation Award should be a minimum requirement for pool attendants and patrolling lifesavers at aquatic locations. Furthermore, all persons responsible for the administration of first aid on frequent occasions or in the work place are encouraged to become qualified.
