


We enjoyed plenty of great conversations and look forward to welcoming our community back for Cool Seniors programming, returning this August during Senior's Month.

From the Water Safety Unit

As of 30 June 2025, an incredible 35,881 children across the Northern Territory have been registered in the Water Safety Awareness Program since it's inception in 2003.

Over the 2024–2025 financial year alone, 1856 new registrations were received, reflecting strong community engagement and the ongoing importance of early water safety education.

Delivered by the Water Safety Unit and funded by the Northern Territory Government, this free program supports parents and caregivers of children under five to build water awareness and confidence through practical sessions in pools and home environments. It's a vital first step in creating safe habits around water from a young age. If you have a child under five and haven't yet enrolled, now is the perfect time to join the program.


On 14 June, Royal Life Saving NT held an AUSTSWIM Teacher of Infant and Preschool Aquatics extension course. The one-day course focuses on the unique needs of children aged up to 5 years, equipping teachers with the skills to plan and deliver safe, engaging, and developmentally appropriate lessons.

Participants explored early childhood development, water familiarisation strategies, and how to create a nurturing, play based learning environment that builds trust with both children and their caregivers.
