ROLE AND RE	ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES	
Aim	To inform, collaborate and co-design a national aquatic workforce capability framework.	
Objectives	The framework will focus on:	
	 Strengthening the safety, quality and capability of the workforce Map out and more accurately describe the depth and breadth of employment pathways and career development opportunities, and Develop a cohesive framework for professional development, registration and equivalency in the aquatic workforce. 	
	The intent of developing a framework is to enhance pathways, strengthen workforce development, improve talent retention and attraction, and reduce risk associated with uncertain professional registration arrangements for various roles.	
Scope	The symposium provides an opportunity to convene on the development of the framework and will employ a engaging and collaborative approach. The program will include keynote presentations, panel discussions, working group sessions, and interactive workshops. The goal is to foster open dialogue and co-design of the national aquatic workforce capability framework.	
	The framework scope will include aquatic industry roles such as lifeguards, swimming and water safety teachers, reception staff, supervisors and team leaders up to aquatic facility management. Royal Life Saving recognises and is committed to working collaboratively with a range of peak bodies, including AUSActive, to maintain alignment and recognition of the equivalent fitness framework by AUSActive addressing fitness staff in aquatic facilities.	
Selection	The Symposium will bring together a multi-stakeholder group, representing targeted segments of the aquatic industry. It will not be possible to include every individual or organisation who will want to be there.	
	To manage this process, expressions of interest to participate are sought from members of the wider aquatic industry with invitations to interested industry organisations, businesses, associations, training and education providers and regulatory bodies.	
	Those that cannot attend due to capacity limits, are invited to contribute to the scoping survey and there will be widespread industry consultation on the framework draft(s).	
	Selection criteria will include (but not be limited to):	
	 Relevant knowledge, skills and experience in the areas of the aquatic industry relevant to workforce development, quality assurance and work health safety Track record of support for collaborative standards/research/frameworks development with Royal Life Saving Geographic and other distributional factors that would make the symposium representative of the aquatic industry at large. Including: Aquatic facility ownership and management structures and models Aquatic facility workers Industry peak bodies 	
	 Research and advocacy representatives Peak industry training organisation status Capacity and capability to support delivery on the objectives and responsibilities outlined in the Terms. 	



Taskforce(s)Targeted taskforces may be established to dive deeper on particular issues or elements of the
framework, to assist with drafting the framework, and/or for supporting industry consultation.
Taskforces will be appointed as subject matter experts for the initiative.

Appointment will be made based on availability, capability and capacity to deliver on the task(s) during the second quarter of 2024.

INDIVIDUAL RESPONSIBILITIES	
Individuals	Participants are expected to adhere to a high standard of professionalism, respect, and collaboration throughout the symposium. To ensure a constructive and inclusive environment, the following guidelines should be observed for both the symposium and any taskforce(s):

	 Commit to supporting and working collaboratively towards the delivery of the initiative(s) and agreed outcomes Carry out action items according to agreed responsibilities and due dates, including the completion of the National Aquatic Workforce Framework Survey Declare any conflicts of interest Act throughout in the interest of the community and/or industry as a whole, not only in the interests of the individual participant or participant's organisation
Proxies	Should an accepted participant be unable to attend the Symposium due to unforeseen circumstances, participants can nominate a proxy for nomination to attend the symposium. Royal Life Saving shall have the final say on any proxy candidacy, and a completed EOI and Terms of Reference form must be submitted with the application for proxy status.
